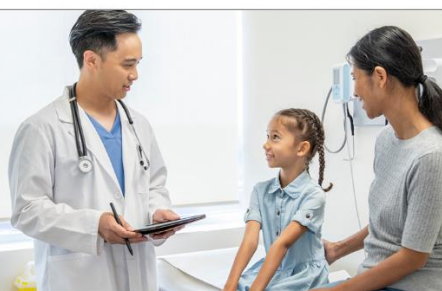

### PRIVATE HEALTHCARE FACILITIES ORDINANCE The impact on small practice clinics and healthcare establishments

The enacted [Private Healthcare Facilities Ordinance Cap 633 \(PHFO\)](#), which was gazetted on 30 November 2018, repeals the Medical Clinics Ordinance and its subsidiary legislation. PHFO also applies to clinics and health services establishment. There are specific requirements for management of private healthcare facilities, such as non-government organisations (NGOs) that provide services for health improvement, health maintenance and services to manage patients with disabilities.

This education webinar aims to analyse the impact of PHFO on small practice clinics and healthcare establishments from the healthcare management, health risk management, legal and implementation perspectives by three distinguished speakers – **Dr Kar-Wai Tong, Dr Yat Chow and David Kan.**
